Enabling Environment and Policy Influence

To strengthen the clean energy sector, All On has committed \$474,000 for mini-grid electrification in the Niger Delta. We also work on innovative financial initiatives, such as local currency debt financing, to scale solar home system (SHS) deployments.

Looking ahead, All On aims to connect 1 million low-income households and SMEs to clean energy by 2030. With a clear pathway and successful programs like DARES, All On is positioned to meet these ambitious goals, contributing to Nigeria's energy transition and economic development.

All On's strategic framework is built on four key pillars:

Impact Investing: Providing equity and debt investments to energy companies to support their growth and scalability.

Enabling Finance: Creating financial mechanisms to unlock additional capital for off-grid energy companies.

Enabling Environment:

Driving policy reforms and regulatory changes to facilitate the expansion of clean energy solutions in Nigeria.

The All On Hub: A critical component of All On's strategy, the Hub provides comprehensive support to early-stage energy access businesses. This includes legal, marketing, and financial advisory services, aimed at scaling innovative energy solutions and fostering entrepreneurship in the off-grid sector.

The D.A.R.T. Program

The **Demand Aggregation for Renewable Technologies (DART) Programme** is a flagship initiative under All On, designed to scale renewable energy access by supporting the deployment of mini-grids and standalone solar systems across Nigeria. DART is a key driver in achieving All On's mission of bridging the energy gap, particularly in off-grid and underserved areas.

Key Success Highlights:

- **\$19.5 million** in approved funds across **13 successful applicants**.
- Supported the development of **83 mini-grids** and facilitated **2,536 solar energy systems (SES)**.
- **133,000 expected energy connections**, contributing significantly towards All On's target of 1 million low-income household and SME connections by 2030.
- As of Q3 2024, **\$8.5 million** has been disbursed, with **\$3 million** fully repaid and reinvested to expand the program further.
